Community Needs Assessment: Treatment and Recovery Templates

Access to Treatment/Recovery

- Context and conditions affecting treatment/recovery
 - Needs of people in treatment/recovery
 - Impact of those needs on services
- Accessibility of Services
 - Availability, Appropriateness, Accessibility, Adequacy, and Affordability

Assets, Gaps, and Resources

- Divided into three section:
 - Assets and Opportunities
 - Constraints and Gaps
 - Possible Federal, State, and Local Resources

Population of Focus and Service Systems: Guidance from JBS

Guidance from JBS (HRSA's TA Provider):

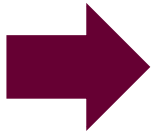
Guidance from JBS (HRSA's TA Provider) on Overall Goal: Assess findings for populations of focus, including a summary of quantitative and qualitative data from the perspective of prevention, treatment, and/or recovery. Identify prevalence and severity of needs as well as impact on and demand for services. Summarize relevant context and conditions affecting populations of focus.

Assess findings for service systems, including summary of existing efforts for prevention, treatment, and recovery; availability and access to care; assets and opportunities; and gaps and constraints. Estimate prevalence of and demand for OUD services. Identify existing and possible federal, state, and local resources that can be leveraged.

Access to Treatment/Recovery Care: Template & Guidance from OU/PIRE

ACCESS TO TREATMENT

Guiding questions to consider from OU/PIRE:

Summary of Context and Conditions Affecting Treatment

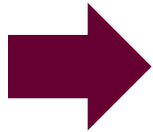
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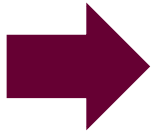

Treatment and Recovery Templates: Helpful Tips

- Goals of the Treatment and Recovery Templates:
 - Describe the context and conditions affecting services
 - Describe existing services in terms of accessibility
 - Identify assets, gaps, and resources related to prevention services

- Think broadly when considering the needs of patients accessing treatment and recovery care.

- Consider multiple types of recovery supports available in your community.

- Complete the community responses as best as you can. If information or data is unavailable, simply write this in the response area.

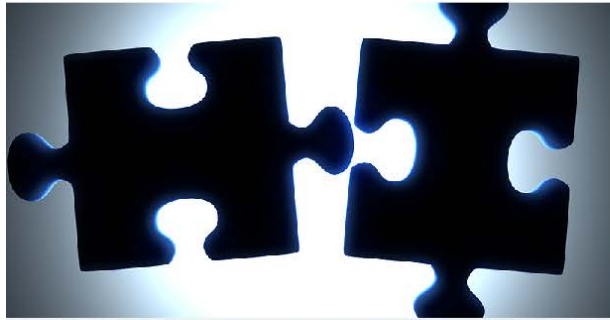

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Core Activity 2: Needs and Gaps Assessment



In order for our community of practice to be successful, each activity must be properly placed in a relevant local context. The first step to contextual analysis is to conduct a needs assessment of the local resources, barriers, and services in each community. Each community conducts a detailed analysis to identify opportunities and gaps in OUD prevention, treatment (including MAT), and/or recovery workforce, services, and access to care within the target rural service area and existing federal, state, and local OUD resources that could be leveraged within the rural community.

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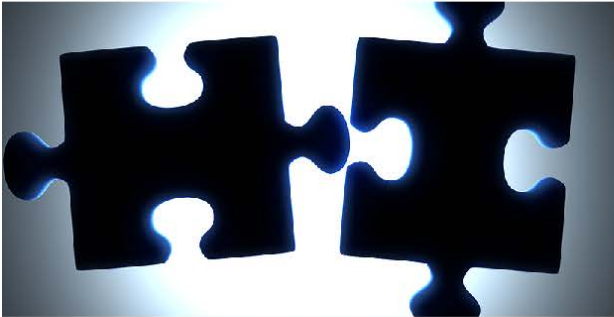
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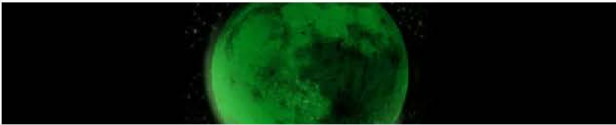
