### Completed COP-RCORP Consortium Work on RCORP-Implementation Core Activities:

**Prevention #2a** – Provide and assess the impact of culturally and linguistically appropriate education to improve family members', caregivers', and the public's understanding of evidence-based treatments and prevention strategies for SUD/OD and to eliminate stigma associated with the disease. Operationalized with Master Consortium Position Statement on CLAS standards. (Will be revisited periodically).

### **COP-RCORP Core Planning and Implementation Value(s)**

1. Consider how the work of the COP-RCORP Master Consortium impacts the affordability and accessibility of OUD/SUD services in the COP-RCORP Service Area.
